

SHARI BLAUKOPF MATERIALS LIST FOR WORKSHOPS

PAPER AND SKETCHBOOKS:

Surfaces are so important! I use a variety of papers and sketchbooks for painting. My favourite sketchbooks these days are a Hahnemuhle 100% Cotton Sketchbook (A4 size) and a sketchbook from Saunders Waterford (11" x 10") with 100% deckle edge watercolour paper in it. Sometimes I also use a Travelogue Watercolour Journal. Here are the links for these.

I will be demonstrating in watercolor sketchbooks and occasionally on an Arches CP pad. Please use a sketchbook with good quality watercolor paper, as a mixed media book with thin paper will not allow you to achieve good watercolour results and you'll be frustrated. *You don't need all of the above, but one good sketchbook would be welcome.* If you are not sure if your current sketchbook is good, just email me. I have tried most books on the market.

PIGMENT AND PALETTE:

Any folding watercolor palette with spaces for pigment and a large mixing area is fine. You'll also need a couple of small water bottles with reliable seals for your painting water. I like Nalgene bottles because they're leakproof.

Here are the colors I generally use. **If you already have colors you like, please use those**. I use many brands of paint including Daniel Smith, M. Graham, Holbein and Winsor Newton. I prefer to fill empty half pans in my palette with tube colors (rather than using pre-filled half pans) since fresh paint is creamier and needs less water to be released, but if you have pans, that is fine as long as they are not dried out!

COLOURS IN MY PALETTE (I use these often):

YELLOWS: Azo Yellow or Hansa Yellow Medium, Lemon Yellow, New Gamboge or Quinacridone Gold, Naples Yellow

BLUES: Cerulean Blue, Ultramarine, Cobalt Blue, Prussian Blue (sometimes I use Cerulean Blue Hue from Da Vinci)

REDS: Alizarin Crimson (or Carmine), Organic Vermilion, Quinacridone Rose, Quinacridone Coral

EARTH COLORS: Burnt Sienna, Raw Sienna (or Yellow Ochre)

I ALSO USE THESE FREQUENTLY: Lavender, Turquoise Blue, Brilliant Orange, Carbazole Violet, Hookers Green

OPTIONAL (I use these sometimes):

Cobalt Green, Black, Titanium White watercolor (I use this straight from the tube so it is never on the palette) or White Gouache for highlights.

Note: I may also have some new colours with me that I am trying out.

PENS:

My favourite pen is a **Platinum Desk Pen with an Extra-Fin Nib**:

It comes with a cartridge that is not waterproof, so I buy these instead:

BRUSHES:

I use a wide variety of brushes (both rounds and flats) but if you have one good travel round (#8 or #10) with a sharp point (synthetic or sable), you can paint most of your sketch with these. I also like to use a rigger brush for wires and branches (#3). Good travel brush brands are Rosemary, Da Vinci and Escoda. A water reservoir brush is NOT recommended.

- My favourite flat brush is a Robert Simmons Sapphire S21 ¾" flat One Stroke
- My favourite round brush is Winsor & Newton Series 7, #7, but it is very expensive and not necessary

GENERAL:

- Mechanical pencil or No. 2 pencil (HB) pencil (and a sharpener if you use this)
- Kneaded rubber eraser
- White Gelly Roll Pen for highlights (unless you use white gouache)
- Ink pens: I use a variety of Micron or Pitt pens, as well as a Platinum Carbon Desk Pen, but any fine waterproof pen will work. It's nice to have different sizes on hand.
- A water-soluble pen for quick sketches or value sketches. I use a Pilot Fineliner or a Pilot Varsity
- Sunscreen, bug spray and a hat for being outdoors all day
- Paper towels for blotting or spills
- Bulldog clips

FOLDING STOOL AND EASEL:

I travel with a folding watercolour easel for demonstrations. If you have one, feel free to use it or work on your lap if you are more comfortable that way. Just make sure you have a board for your sketchbook and palette so you are not leaning over your work to reach your water. (see link below)

You should have a folding stool to sit on and a way to work comfortably on your lap if you are seated.
